Statistics


- 2nd largest country in the UK

- Battles against England at Stirling Bridge (Wallace) and Bannockburn (Robert the Bruce)








History 2

- James Watt (steam engine)





THE HISTORY OF GLASGOW

- Glasgow in Gaelic is Glaschu meaning "green glen" or "green place".
- Development in 550AD with the arrival of St Kentigern (St Mungo).
- Trade with the Americas developed in the 18th Century.









THE RIVER CLYDE & INDUSTRY

- By the 18th Century, the River Clyde became the heart of Glasgow.
- The tobacco trade ended, but the Industrial Revolution brought numerous trades to Glasgow, but most importantly, shipbuilding.







 Industrial decline reduces the inner city's population and highrise development schemes replaced Glasgow's tenements.











 Tourism has been increasing in Glasgow, aided by the Scottish Events Campus.

EDUCATION & CULTURE

- University of Glasgow, founded in 1451 and University of Strathclyde in 1796.
- Glasgow offers many cultural experiences including Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum and the Glasgow Royal Concert Hall.
- Scotland's most famous rivalry takes place at Hampden Park.

Willie McRae then became Abraham Levy's partner.




Len Murray joined the firm in the late 1950s.


